## *A Message From* **the Director of Martyrs' Shrine**

“ As we prepare for the coming spring, I sense among the Jesuits and staff a spirit of gratitude for what has been, and what is to come. It is indeed our privilege to welcome you, and to serve you, and we very much look forward to journeying alongside you, walking with St. Jean de Brébeuf and his companions towards a deeper union with Christ Jesus. “

It is always difficult, in so few words, to articulate the depth of graces that arise from the ministry here at Martyrs' Shrine. This past summer, we again welcomed just shy of 100,000 pilgrims, over three thousand school children, various bus tours, a number of lake-bearing cruise ships, priest and religious in our Magis Guest House for Rest and Renewal, retreatants from across the province, and some 9,000 participants in First Light (our Christmas festival of light in partnership with Sainte-Marie among the Hurons).

Though one could amass a 'number' of visitors, we are very much aware that each person came with their own story, and indeed their own needs, as they prayed with St. Jean de Brébeuf and his companions, attended the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Mass, took time for mediation in one of our gardens, or shared time with family and friends. The Jesuit Fathers


here, and the staff, were privileged to be, in one way or another, with each one, and together, through prayer, spiritual conversation, and service, witnessed God's loving grace in action.

Among the visitors, three very special guests took up residence with us. As you will read, the Filipino Community of Dolorosa Canada sponsored the enthronement of our Lady of Sorrows in the Shrine. With her, and still by the generosity of this association, once again, statues of St. Jean de Brébeuf and St. Gabriel Lalemant stand outside the entrance of the Church. This coming season, we shall also welcome three Jesuit priests who will assist us in our service to you over the summer months. Fr. George Vallocheril, SJ, Fr. John Kennedy, SJ, and Fr. Adam Hinks, SJ. Fr. George, a renown media expert in India, will offer a Film Retreat. Fr. John, an expert in the Spiritual Exercises of

Ignatius Loyola, will be on-hand for spiritual conversation. And, Fr. Adam, an astrophysicist by training, will offer us an evening seminar of faith and science. Moreover, we are pleased to welcome, once again, the Narrows Ensemble, in continuation of our new annual concert series, entitled: Divine Mystery: Classical Music at Martyrs' Shrine.

This past season, we also secured new operators for Les Trois Soeurs Café, now open again to all visitors with, I must say, a delicious menu. Opening too, this spring, will be our Look-out Tower, rebuilt with the generous support of the Ontario-wide Knights of Columbus. Both the Café and the Look-Out are important features to the experience we offer all pilgrims and I, for one, am excited to see them once again available to all.

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## OUR LADY OF SORROWS COMES TO MARTYRS' SHRINE

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Of all the titles, and devotions to the Mother of God, why should one be devoted to the Sorrowful Mother? As children of God, we all experience suffering. Be it physical, emotional, or spiritual, we all will experience it to different degrees. But, we must not suffer alone. We have someone to look to, who has Herself experienced tremendous suffering as she witnessed the sacrifice Her Son made for the sins of the world. Our Lady, Mother of Jesus can, for us, be a source of inspiration and strength as we search for the courage to face our sorrows - as we grow towards a deeper union with Christ.

The Filipino Community of Dolorosa Canada has a strong devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows. Being comprised mostly of newcomers to Canada, the members of this community have a deep bond with our Mother, as, much like them, Our Lady has experienced a long journey of sorrow and rebirth travelling to unfamiliar territory, for Her Son, leaving Her native land to travel to Egypt escaping from the dangers King Herod posed to Jesus. Members of the Dolorosa Canada community often have looked to Our Lady, to pray through Her intercession, seeking healing of their sorrows, so that they may too find peace knowing they have the support of Our Mother, and the strength of their faith through Jesus.

Dolorosa Canada has been an active community at Martyrs' Shrine providing support to the annual Filipino Catholic Community Pilgrimage. Having seen the likes of


Saint Pedro Calunsod and San Lorenzo Ruiz on the sacred grounds our Martyrs once walked, the community of Dolorosa Canada pondered the need and benefits of having the sacred grounds complimented with the addition of Our Lady of Sorrows so that many other faithful pilgrims can pray through Our Mother's intercession for healing of their sorrow.

They quickly commissioned award-winning artist, from the town of Paete, Laguna, King Baldemor, with the help of Msgr. Charles Herrera, who is the rector of the National Shrine to Our Lady of Sorrows in the Philippines. Through the financial support of the membership, family, and friends of the Dolorosa Canada community, the statue was produced, shipped, and unveiled at a special Mass at Martyrs' Shrine in the fall of 2019. It is the hopes of the community that all our pilgrims from Canada and other parts of the World are inspired by this statue at Martyrs' Shrine, and follow the teaching of our Blessed Mother for generations to come.

## A BRIEF BIOGRAPHY ON ST. JEAN DE BRÉEBUF



St. Jean de Brébeuf (called Échon by the Hurons), a Jesuit priest, is known as the founder of the Huron mission. Born 25 March 1593, at Condé-sur-Vire in Lower Normandy, and martyred 16 March 1649 at the village of Saint-Ignace in Wendake. He was canonized 29 June 1930 by Pius XI and proclaimed by Pius XII on 16 October 1940 patron saint of Canada along with his seven martyred companions. When he was 24, Brébeuf entered the Jesuit noviciate in Rouen. And pronounced his final vows in January of 1630 after being forced to return to France from his first trip to New France from 1625 to 1629 where he had taken up residence at Toaniché; among the Bear tribe of the Wendat peoples.

He returned to New France in 1633 where, this time, he was entrusted by his superior, Fr. Paul le Jeune, with the task of both founding and organizing a mission. Three posts would be set-up by Brébeuf before the founding of the mission of Sainte-Marie in 1639. The mission of Sainte-Marie would

operate for nearly 11 years before being burned down by the Jesuits in 1649; so as to prevent its strategic use by the Iroquois who were at war with the Wendat.

The years 1647–48 marked the beginning of the annihilation of the Huron nation. Until then, the Iroquois had restricted themselves to surprising the convoys of traders along the St. Lawrence, but afterwards moved their efforts to the very heart of the Wendat nation.

On 4 July 1648, taking advantage of the fact that the Hurons had gone trading, a band of Iroquois threw themselves upon the villages of Saint-Joseph and Saint-Michel and took 700 prisoners. Fr. Antoine Daniel, Jesuit missionary, fell, riddled with arrows. The village of Saint-Joseph II (Teanaostaiaë) formed with La Conception (Ossossané) and Sainte-Marie, the triangular base of Huron resistance. On 16 March of the following year (1649) more than 1,000 Iroquois attacked Saint-Ignace (Taenhatentaron), then Saint-Louis, where Brébeuf and Fr. Gabriel Lalemant were carrying on their evangelical efforts.

The two missionaries were taken prisoner and carried off to Saint-Ignace, where they suffered one of the most severe martyrdoms in the annals of Christianity. Brébeuf's torture has been told to us with moving simplicity by the donné Christophe Regnault, who saw his remains: "Father de Brébeuf had his legs, thighs, and arms stripped of flesh to the very bone; I saw and touched a large number of

great blisters, which he had on several places on his body, from the boiling water which his attackers had poured over him in mockery of Holy Baptism. I saw and touched the wound from a belt of bark, full of pitch and resin, which roasted his whole body. I saw and touched the marks of burns from the Collar of hatchets placed on his shoulders and stomach. I saw and touched his two lips, which they had cut off because he constantly spoke of God while they made him suffer."

The remains of St. Jean de Brébeuf and St. Gabriel Lalemant were returned to the mission of Sainte-Marie and buried in its cemetery alongside Wendat Christians. With the destruction of the mission, at the Jesuits' own hand, in 1649, the bodies were exhumed, their bones taken to Quebec, and their flesh remains put back to their graves.

Today, the skull of St. Jean de Brébeuf is exposed within the Church at Martyrs' Shrine where thousands of pilgrims come to pray through his intercession.

Many of their prayers focused around the eventual employment and family life they hoped for their children. Often times, praying feeling their children needed nothing short of a miracle!

Their eldest son, the "rebel" of the family, was first to be recipient of his parent's prayers. They were shortly answered when while working at a local Zellers, he received an offer to move to the city to pursue a corporate opportunity, and is now a successful businessman.

His two siblings later followed in his footsteps, but on their own prospective paths, each now having built successful careers and blessed with loving families.

Mr. and Mrs. Brough believe that their story is not unique to their family, but that it is when people are called to live their faith, that they become more skillfull in recognizing when special favours are granted no matter how simple, or complex.

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## UPDATE ON THE FIRE SUPPRESSION SYSTEM

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Over the course of the 2019 season, we've been promoting a "Toonie Challenge" to help raise funds for the Fire Suppression System in the Church of St. Joseph.

Our faithful pilgrims, as always, have answered the call to give with generosity, and we've successfully raised \$61,293 through this campaign.

The annual Tiawenk Fundraising Dinner & Auction also dedicated this year's funds raised to the Fire Suppression System, resulting in an additional \$50,000 raised.

The funds raised to-date account for nearly \$150,000.00 of the estimated \$225,000.00 of the total project cost.

The next phase of the system upgrades will be conducted inside the Church this coming year.

Our Toonie Challenge will continue to run over the 2020 season, and we hope to close the financial gap needed to complete the project in totality.

We wish to thank everyone who has made a contribution, big or small, to our Fire Suppression project.

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## UPDATE ON THE LOOKOUT PROJECT

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The Lookout has been the centre of a project lead by the Knights of Columbus since its closure during the 2018 season as a safety precaution.

Originally, the proposed project was to be comprised of a total demolition and the construction of a new combination lookout tower and outdoor altar. As the project progressed however, feedback from

the parties involved shifted from demolishing the existing structure to preserving the landmark that has been integral to the landscape of our upper field for decades.

Instead of being demolished and rebuilt, the lookout tower will be preserved, and upgraded to meet current engineering and building code specifications. This includes removing

the second level, constructing a compliant ramp, adding structural support throughout, and undertaking proper forestry management nearby to revitalize the view of Georgian Bay.

The project has already begun, and it is anticipated that the lookout be opened early in our 2020 season.


