Saint Noël Chabanel

"I can't, Lord, I just cannot speak the language of the people to whom you sent me. I was always good in languages. I know all the European languages well. In fact, I have taught them. But I just can't learn the language of these people. The kids mock me. The adults laugh at me. All the other Jesuits have been able to learn and speak the language, but I just can't. I have tried hard. I have given all my time to it, but I just cannot get the sounds, nor the meaning of the words. I am useless here. Maybe I should just go back to France. No! O God, I promise before you never to abandon these people. I promise never to leave this land."

In today's Gospel Jesus sends out his disciples. Four hundred years ago, he sent Noël to New France to share the Good News of the Gospel. But Noël could not do the job. He was a failure. He had to trust completely on God.

Sometimes we are overwhelmed by the challenges and responsibilities of life. We say, "I can't." But that is precisely when we are called to trust, to trust in God and to depend on the goodness and generosity of others. When we let others help us, we call forth the love and the goodness that is in them. We give them the opportunity to love and to serve. Stubborn independence, total self-reliance, only leads to isolation and loneliness. Allowing others to assist gets the job done and leads to unity and to friendship. Jesus did not send his disciples out alone. He sent them out two by two. It is in companionship that the best work is done. There is an exchange of ideas and a pooling of talent. It is in companionship that we can experience the success and the joy of being messengers of the Gospel. It is in companionship that we can really experience God and help others to meet God.
