No Time to Rest

This is a classic case of the busy and hectic time Jesus and His disciples were going through in their mission of proclaiming the Good News about the arrival of the Kingdom of God in their midst. The Time was right, the harvest is great, but the workers were very few, and time was running out before the torture and cruxification of Jesus. They were all in real hurry to get the word of God out before it was all over.

But the Lord in all His compassion and love for the helpless, lost and frightened sheep of Israel took pity on them, and gave them the spiritual food which the were hungering for. From this, we should learn to be humble and learn from Jesus to always care for others despite our human limitations, even if we receive false hospital calls at 2am. It's not always an easy task of living the gospel, as actions speak louder than words, we are all called to Love and Serve in His Name.
