Thanks Dad

One of my happy experiences as a priest is watching the father of the bride walk up the aisle of the church with his daughter on his arm. He has invited his extended family and his closest friends to see this moment. His chest is extended. He is proud, as he sees everyone gazing on his daughter, who is smiling and so beautifully dressed. She is being presented to the love of her life. To this chosen man she will publicly pronounce her marriage vows. I can just hear the father of the bride humming to himself with amazement, like the Fiddler on the Roof: "Is this the little girl I carried? Is this the little boy at play? I don't remember growing older. When did they?"

Later in the day, in his toast to the bride, in the language of today's reading from Ezechiel, he will remember his daughter as a tiny sprig from the top of the cedar tree that has grown up into a majestic cedar. He is not sure how all this happened. How did she learn from him, and what did she learn?

What are the lessons your father taught you? My father taught me the Lord's Prayer and the Hail Mary. He taught me how to say those prayers sincerely. My father taught me how to be thoughtful and kind to others – the way he was so kind to my mother and to us kids. My father taught me to be compassionate. My father taught me patience. And though long deceased, he continues to teach me now.

Whether your father is now in heaven, or still with you on earth, today is a day to thank God for him. For sure, he was not perfect. But, he probably tried his best to help you grow into the person you are today, into the person you are still becoming. The kingdom of God in you is like a mustard seed. What your father began, can continue to grow, if you keep remembering his teachings.

Fathers are proud of their children. Even when children go off track, fathers are, or want to be, prodigal with their love. They will wait for us to keep on growing. When they appear before the judgment seat of God, they will say, "Here is the little girl, the little boy, you gave me. I don't know how they grew up so well. Father, you were in them. You are in them now. And you will always be in them. Thank you for having given me the privilege of being a father. I am proud of my children. I am proud of all you have accomplished through me for my children and grandchildren. Praise to you, oh God, our Father.
