# WEEKLY REFLECTION

# **Genesis & Reconciliation**

This Sunday we return to Ordinary Time, after a long string of major post-Easter Feast Days: the Ascension, Pentecost, Trinity, Corpus Christi. Today we get back to the rhythm of "ordinary" Sundays, even if there is nothing ordinary about the life of worship! The word "ordinary" when used to refer to liturgical time means that it is unfolding according to a plan or order, and not anything plain or humdrum. Ordinary Time is part of the great adventure.

Therefore on this Tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time, we turn to the readings, which continue to tell us the story of God's plan for us. The first reading from Genesis takes us back to the origins of sin in the world. We see Adam and Eve playing the blame game, not owning their responsibility in their turning from God. To always blame someone else is a very sad human tendency. To take ownership of our failures is a sign of maturity. Since "sin" means "to miss the mark", asking forgiveness for our mark-missings is what restores us to "communion" in our relationships. We can believe that if Adam and Eve had asked God forgiveness instead of pointing the finger at someone else, he would have forgiven and reconciled with them in the garden.

Jesus shows us the extent to which God is willing to reconcile his people to himself. God is willing to come into our world, both literally into the whole world, and personally into your world, in order to meet us. He initiates the reconciliation. Let us always run to meet him as he comes to us, confident in his great mercy, and desiring to be always in communion with him. He does not disappoint but calls us higher into his divine life.
